Play is on the Extinction List

A major study by the
National Children's Bureau
found that half of all
children have been stopped
from climbing trees, 21%
have been banned from
running on the playground
and 17% have been told they
cannot take part in games of
tag or chase. I am scared
that PLAY is on the
Extinction list.

What did you play as a child?

- Did you always have a goal in mind?
- Were the props you used bought or found?
- Did you play by yourself or with others?
- Did you take a class to learn how to play?
- How much of your play included adults?

The answers are probably that you played with other children with very little adult supervision and you made up the rules as the activity developed.

We have plenty of evidence that Play is important for children's growth and development:

- Emotion and Cognition seems to increase during play
- Retention of information increases by during natural play
- Play helps develop problem solving skills
- When movement and language occurs during play cognition increases

We must prevent play from going extinct....

Lots of activities are being disguised as Play:

coloring books

crafts

organized sports for young children

dance, gymnastics, music classes

Natural Play - is spontaneous and comes from the child....

I am Counting on YOU to Prevent Play from going EXTINCT!

- •provide blanket/sheets for tent making
- •bring back Red Rover, London Bridge and Kick the Can
- allow rolling down hills
- •encourage climbing higher then their bodies
- provide boxes for getting in and out of
- play cops and robbers
